CCF FY07 3rd Quarterly Report Highlights:

Collaboration with UVA – An Engaged Scholars Work Group will commence this month and it is charged with outlining a necessary University infrastructure needed to support a formal office of Community-University Partnerships for Learning and Research. CCF has already begun to build productive partnerships with UVA by working on research projects with graduate students, undergraduate students, faculty and staff!

Human Services Strategic Plan – CCF is leading an effort to develop a Human Services Strategic Plan. This Plan brings together local information about community needs along with information about where public dollars currently are being spent. As part of developing this Plan, we have been holding discussions asking people what they have experienced as working and not working in our community, and getting input about possible priorities.

Governor's Youth Community Service and Civic Engagement Grant – The City of Charlottesville and the County of Albemarle, in collaboration with the Teens GIVE Program and the Charlottesville/Albemarle Commission on Children and Families, have developed a grant proposal to provide youth at-risk of gang involvement with service learning opportunities.
