WHO IS CCF?

CCF is a 28-member planning and advisory body to the City of Charlottesville and County of Albemarle. Citizen, community, agency, local government, youth, education, and university leaders work to improve conditions for local children and families. CCF members work to respond to unmet needs of children and families, raise awareness of local conditions, monitor funds, and make recommendations to local governments.

WHAT IS THE COMMITMENT?

A one year appointment. Attend bi-monthly meetings. Meetings are held on the first Wednesday of every other month at the Albemarle County Office Building on 5th Street Extended, from 5:30 pm - 7 pm. Contribute your voice.

WHO CAN APPLY?

No previous experience is necessary. Applications are open to **all interested youth 18 and under who are City residents.**

WHEN IS THE DEADLINE?

Applications are due Monday, June 1st, 2009.
